### Folk with George Fu

This program features works for piano and violin which draws from many rustic inspirations including Schubert's use of Austrian Ländler dances, Bloch's Jewish musical inheritance, and Poulenc's Spanish inspirations and the influence of Parisian Café music.

Pianist-composer George Fu draws on his experience as a second-generation Asian immigrant, writing a new work which transcribes and transforms melodies from his Chinese and American upbringing. Each "Classical" work will be preceded by samples of the folk music which it contains played as a prelude.

### **Chez Clara**

#### with George Fu

Inspired by Clara Schumann's own programmes and the extensive concert tours she undertook with the violinist Joseph Joachim, these programmes follow her lead including the sonatas by Beethoven, as well as championing the new music of her time.

This programme contains one of her rare compositions, the exquisite 'Three Romances', and also short solo works for each instrumentalist, as was the fashion of the time. This programme celebrates Clara, the greatest pianist of her day, and the central force in her artistic and intellectual circle which she and Robert Schumann cultivated with such care at their home in Leipzig.
